


Sherpath: Student View – Lesson Assignments

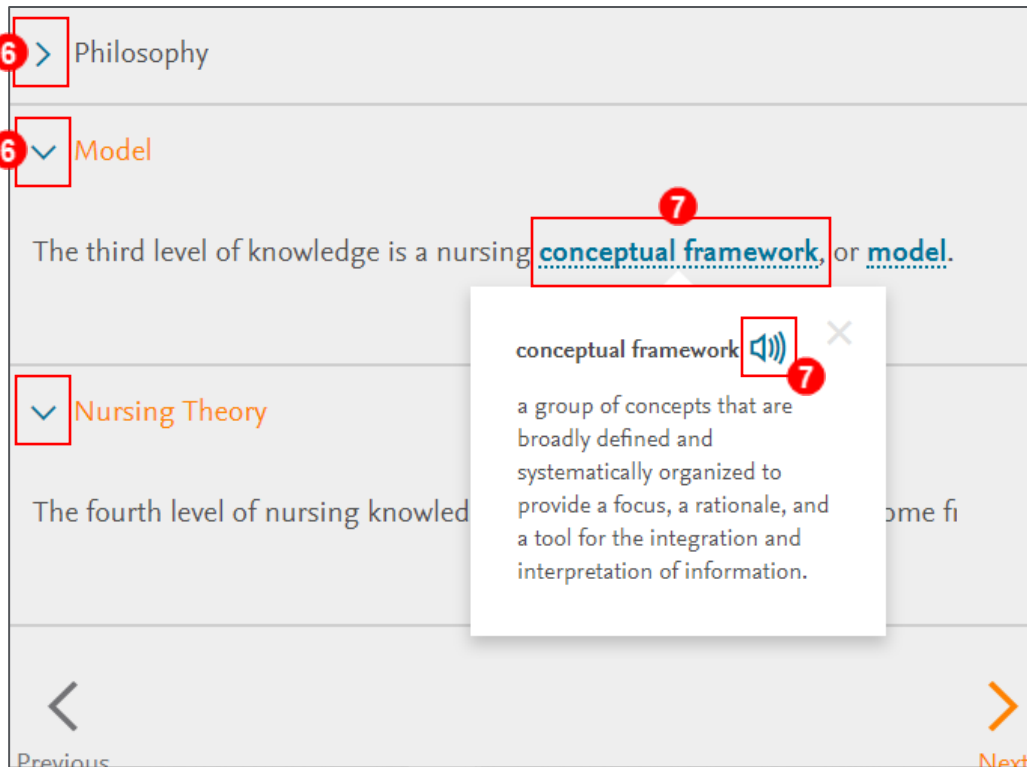

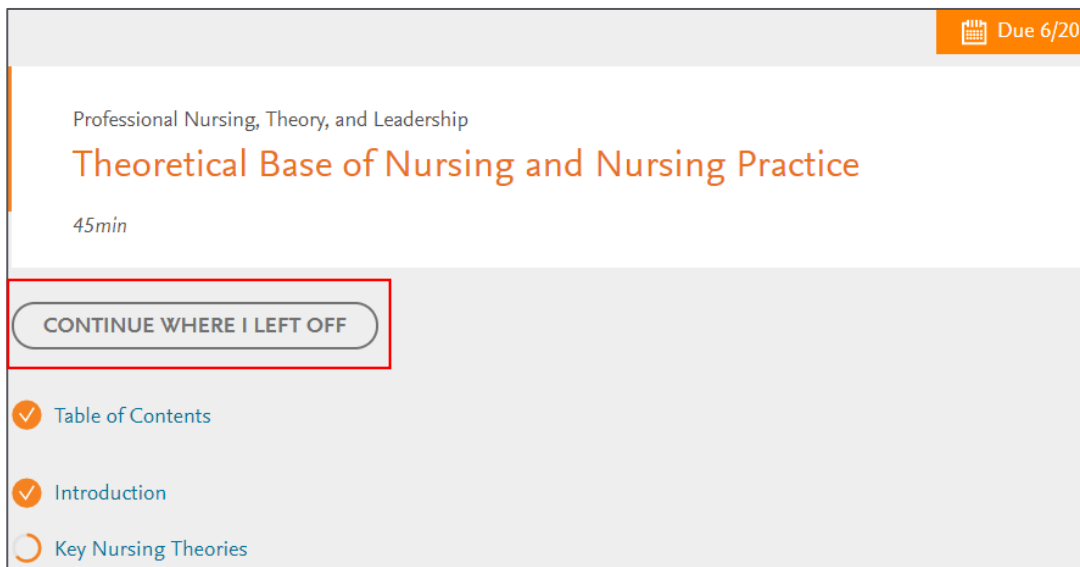
