Advanced Practice Registered Nurse (APRN) Programs On-Site Intensive (OSI) Guide

Q	What is OSI?	
A	On-Site Intensive (OSI) is an in-person, interactive experience usually conducted over the weekend of week 6 of every term. OSI takes place at a site that simulates the real clinical experience students encounter in their clinical placements.	
Q	Is OSI mandatory?	
A	Yes. OSI is required to meet the program objectives and the requirements of APRN regulatory bodies.	
Q	How many OSIs Am I required to complete throughout my program?	
A	Starting Spring II term 2023, every APRN student is required to complete two OSIs. The first OSI is conducted in the first specialty course of the program; the second OSI is conducted in the last clinical course of the program.	
Q	What are the purpose and benefits of OSI?	
A	OSI is designed to complement online learning by preparing students for real-world practice. In addition, OSI allows students to network and connect with peers and faculty. The purpose of the first OSI is to ensure you are ready to start your clinical training. In this OSI, you will practice advanced health assessment skills, motivational interviewing, and hands-on specialty-based open labs. The end-of-of program OSI provides you an opportunity for further synthesis and expansion of the learning you have developed throughout the program.	
Q	What if I have already completed one or two OSIs?	



- A From 2020 to 2022, OSIs used to be virtually completed in advanced health assessment courses (680B and 681) and in the first clinical course of each program (663L-B, 679L-B, 696L, and 686L). The last virtual OSI will be in Spring I 2023.
 - If you completed 2 OSIs by the end of Spring I 2023, then you have completed the required OSI. The information in this document does not apply to you.
 - If you have completed one OSI by the end of Spring I 2023, your second OSI will be in your last clinical course (668L-B or 682L-B).
 - If you have not completed any OSI by the end of Spring I 2023, follow the schedule provided in the next question.

Q How do I find the dates of my OSI?

A Based on your program and class schedule, your advisor can inform you of the dates using the information in the previous questions.

Q My nurse practitioner program belongs to California campus. Where will my OSI be?

- A The OSIs of the APRN programs of California (Anaheim-Orange County) are conducted in Southern California. Usually, the OSI site is WCU Center for Graduate Studies (CGS) located at 590 N Vermont Ave, Los Angeles, CA 90004
- Q My nurse practitioner program belongs to the Texas campus. Where will my OSI be?



A The OSIs of the APRN programs of Texas (Richardson-Dallas County) are conducted at WCU Texas Campus at 2323 N. Central Expressway, Richardson, TX 75080

Q What preparations do I have to make before I attend OSI?

A

- 1. Know the dates of your OSI as soon as possible.
- 2. Mark your calendar and make yourself available.
- 3. Make travel and hotel reservations, if needed. *Make sure to arrive the day prior to the start of the On-Site Intensive*.
- 4. Complete OSI online registration form, which will be available in your course Canvas in week 1 of the term.
- 5. Bring **business casual attire**, **lab coat**, photo identification, and WCU Student badge. Additional information will be posted by your professor in the course that your OSI is connected with.

Q What accommodations does WCU provide?

A Students are responsible for making hotel reservations. We strongly encourage you to select a hotel close to the OSI site where all activities, meals, and services are scheduled. Please plan well in advance to ensure lodging is available. Please familiarize yourself with cancellation rules, deadlines, etc. regarding your travel arrangements with your selected providers.

	Transportation	
	Flights can be scheduled into DFW Airport (DFW) for all airlines except Southwest which should be scheduled into Dallas Love Field Airport (DAL). A limited number of select Alaska and Delta flights also operate out of Dallas Love Field (DAL).	
	The Texas campus is located approximately 17 miles from Dallas Love Field Airport (DAL) and 26 miles from DFW Airport (DFW)	
	If preferred, driving is also an option, but please consider flying if you live more than 250 miles from the Texas campus.	
	Transportation to and from your hotel to campus is not provided.	
Q	What should I wear during OSI?	
A	All students must wear business casual and the required lab coats. Scrubs should not be worn. Please refer to the APRN Practicum Preparation Canvas Course for ordering details.	
Q	Do I need to bring any equipment?	
A	No. A pen and paper are optional.	
Q	What if I missed any of the required OSI?	
A	You will be required to retake the whole course.
